

LIEUTENANT GENERAL JACK C. STULTZ

Chief, Army Reserve

Commanding General, Army Reserve Command



Lt. Gen. Jack C. Stultz became Chief, Army Reserve and Commanding General, Army Reserve Command on May 25, 2006, after retiring from a 28-year career with Procter and Gamble as an operations manager.

Before his promotion to Chief, Army Reserve, Stultz served as the Command's Deputy Commanding General. Prior to assignment to the Army Reserve Command, Stultz served as the Commanding General of the 143rd Transportation Command, which oversees 12 units in the southeastern United States.

Stultz entered active duty in 1974 after receiving his commission from the Reserve Officer Training Corps at Davidson College in North Carolina where he graduated with a bachelor's degree in history. After completing the Engineer Officer Basic Course and Airborne School, he served as Platoon Leader and later as Executive Officer and Commander in the 20th Engineer Battalion.

In June of 1979, Stultz left active duty to pursue a civilian career. He began his work in sales and management at Procter and Gamble, a Fortune 500 company. At the same time, Stultz joined the Army Reserve and was assigned to the 108th Division (Infantry OSUT), headquartered in Charlotte, NC. He served in a variety of positions with the 108th Division, including Brigade Assistant Operations Officer, Battalion Personnel Officer, Commander, Company D, 4th Battalion 108th Regiment and Division Assistant Operations Officer.

Stultz joined the Transportation Corps in February 1987 with an assignment to the 32nd Transportation Group, which was mobilized and deployed in November 1990 in support of Operation Desert Shield/Desert Storm. Stultz took command of the 257th Transportation Battalion in 1995. The battalion deployed to the Balkans in March 1997 for Operation Joint Endeavor/Joint Guard, providing movement control support for operations in Hungary, Croatia and Bosnia.

Stultz deployed to Kuwait from October 2002 to August 2004. He served as Commander of the 143rd TRANSCOM (Forward), establishing initial RSOI operations in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. Stultz is a graduate of the Command and General Staff College and the Army War College. His awards and decorations include the Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit, Bronze Star with oak leaf cluster and the Army Achievement Medal.

Stultz is married to the former Laura Brown. They have four children and three granddaughters.
